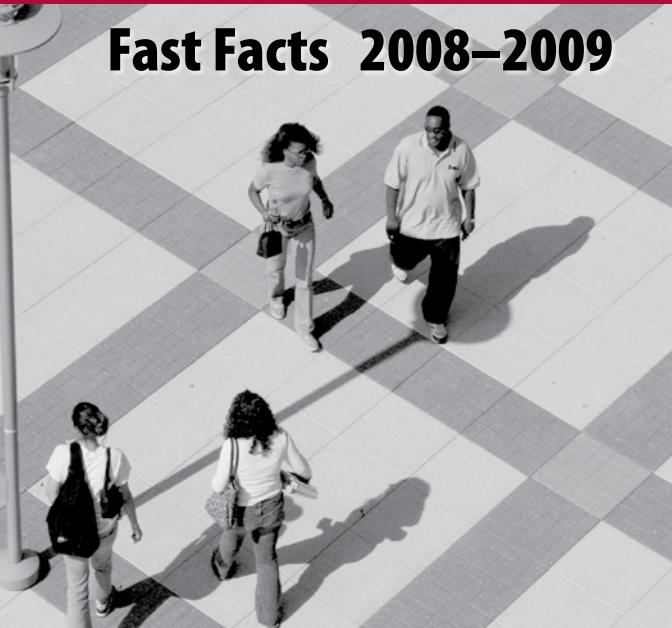

ESTABLISHED IN 1961, AACC is a fully accredited, public, two-year institution offering credit programs leading to an associate degree, certificate or a letter of recognition. Students may prepare for transfer to a four-year institution or move into an immediate career. AACC also offers extensive lifelong learning opportunities and noncredit continuing education courses to those seeking career training or retraining, working to boost basic skills or pursuing new areas of interest.

CAMPUS RESOURCES

- ▶ AACC at Arundel Mills, now designated a Maryland Regional Higher Education Center, is a four-story, 77,000-square-foot facility. It houses the AACC University Consortium, the Teacher Education and Child Care Institute, the new Science, Technology, Math and Engineering (STEM) Center labs, as well as classrooms and labs for other instruction.
- ▶ The Glen Burnie Town Center includes the five-story Arundel Center North and the 10,000-square-foot Hospitality, Culinary Arts and Tourism Institute.
- ▶ Andrew G. Truxal Library offers more than 141,200 books, 250 print periodicals, 5,481 videotapes, 873 audiotapes, 1,423 CDs, 1,351 DVDs and 51 online databases that offer access to more than 12,000 electronic journals and magazines and 625 electronic reference books.
- ▶ The Center for Applied Learning and Technology features design studios and high-tech computer labs for architecture and interior design, continuing education, computer information systems, computer science, electronic and telecommunication engineering technologies and engineering programs.
- ▶ 194 "smart" classrooms and 77 computer labs.
- ▶ 71 student clubs and organizations.
- ▶ 76 percent of campus learning spaces with open wireless areas – including Arnold campus, the Glen Burnie Town Center and AACC at Arundel Mills.
- ▶ 1,747 instructional desktop and laptop computers.

AFFORDABILITY**AACC Scholarships/Financial Aid**

- ▶ The AACC Foundation Inc. awarded \$530,628 to 482 students in FY2008, a 15 percent increase over FY07. Scholarships range from \$250 to \$2,500 per award. The foundation manages more than 180 funds supporting scholarships and college programs. Community organizations and individuals established 12 new funds for priority campus needs through the foundation in FY08.
- ▶ For fall 2008, AACC was the fourth lowest in total tuition cost and fees among all 16 community colleges in Maryland.
- ▶ AACC students received a total of \$15,797,916 in federal financial aid (grants, loans and work study) in FY2008. \$5,350,198 in federal grants was awarded to more than 2,486 students and \$10,119,910 in federal loans was awarded to 3,198 loan applicants. In addition, 1,292 students received \$1,297,800 from Maryland state awards. An unduplicated total of 5,302 students received \$18,717,854 from all sources of financial aid.

FINANCIAL AID

THE COLLEGE BELIEVES no student should be restricted from attending because of limited financial resources. Many students receive financial aid through a combination of need-based federal and state grants, federal student and parent loans, employment through the Federal Work-Study and Institutional Student Employment Programs, interest-free payment plans or an extensive list of institutional, community and state scholarship funds.

MEASURE OF SUCCESS

- ▶ **More degrees and certificates awarded** than any other single-campus community college in Maryland.
- ▶ **Best four-year transfer/graduation rate** for full-time students among our peer colleges.
- ▶ **The Class of 2008** saw 1,534 graduates receive 1,247 degrees and 363 certificates.
- ▶ **31.6 percent of all 2008 high school graduates** in Anne Arundel County are enrolled as freshmen at Anne Arundel Community College.
- ▶ **111 AACC students volunteered** to work as greeters and technical support at polling places in Anne Arundel County during the 2008 general election as part of the Learning through Service program.
- ▶ **Interior design students** won seven statewide American Society of Interior Designers awards in fall 2008.
- ▶ **Above the national average** on the NCLEX-RN Licensure Exam: AACC's nursing program achieved a pass rate of 90 percent in May 2007 and 90 percent in December 2007.
- ▶ **The AACC Foundation provided \$1.3M** to AACC students for scholarships, program support, new initiatives and campus expansion at Arundel Mills.
- ▶ **Three of four AACC fall women's teams** – soccer, cross country and volleyball – captured 2008 NJCAA regional championship titles.
- ▶ **100 percent pass rate** for December 2007 Practical Nursing program graduates. This was the program's first year.
- ▶ **100 percent first-time pass rate** for 2008 Radiologic Technology program graduates.
- ▶ **566 students** enrolled in courses through the AACC University Consortium, July 2007-May 2008.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES

COLLEGE ORGANIZATIONS include academic clubs, campus publications, honor societies, performing groups, recreational clubs, special interest clubs and the Student Association. AACC supports an extensive intercollegiate athletic program including baseball, basketball, cross country, golf, lacrosse, soccer, softball and volleyball.
