



Admission Procedures for Students with Other Visa Types (Not F-1 Visa)

Immigrant and non-immigrant students with other visa types interested in enrolling in credit courses must submit the following:

- Anne Arundel Community College's Application for Admission online at www.aacc.edu/admissions. Paper applications are accepted and may be mailed to the address listed below. To request a paper AACC Application for Admission, call 410-777-2677 or request one via email at admissions@aacc.edu.
- Official SAT or ACT scores. AACC placement tests may be required for enrollment in certain courses.
- Original official transcripts from secondary and post secondary schools attended, which must be translated by a certified translator. To transfer college credit from a foreign college or university to AACC, students must have the foreign transcripts reviewed for US course equivalency by one of the following translating services: World Education Services, Educational Credentials Evaluators or American Association of Collegiate Registrars. Transcripts evaluated by any other organizations will not be accepted.
- Proof of legal immigrant status. For example, valid Permanent Resident or green card, valid work authorization permit, valid visa stamp and I-94 and, letters from USCIS as proof of legal presence in the US.
- If you have been approved for Permanent Resident status, but have not received your card, submit a photocopy of your passport and a copy of the page containing the I-551 stamp.

Tuition

The cost of tuition is determined by the location of a student's residence. Students with Permanent Resident, Refugee, or Asylee status who reside in the state of Maryland for more than 3 months at the time of registration are entitled to an in-state tuition rate in accordance with state law. They may also be eligible for financial aid and scholarships.

Most non-immigrant students are subject to out-of-state tuition rates. Non-immigrant students with A, G, H1, H4, K1, K2, L, N, NATO, O, R, and V visas who reside in the State of Maryland for more than 3 months at the time of registration maybe eligible for an in-state tuition rate, but are generally not eligible for financial aid.

Students who are admitted with other types of visas or status not listed above are subject to an out-of-state tuition rate.
