

Application Procedures for Change of Non-immigrant Status

Changing your lawful non-immigrant status is a serious matter. The procedures outlined below are merely suggestions. The Change of Status Application must be completed and signed by you. You may wish to consult an immigration attorney to assist you, though it is not required. It is your responsibility to make sure you are in compliance with your current immigration status. Most non-immigrants are eligible to request a change to F-1 (student) status if they have maintained their current, lawful status. Individuals in J-1 status who are subject to the two-year home residence requirement (Section 212e) are not eligible for a change of status unless a waiver is granted by the United States Citizenship & Immigration Services (USCIS). The approval of a change of status can take up to 7-8 weeks or more for the USCIS to process. Please comply with the deadlines below:

Deadlines: July 1 for fall enrollment November 1 for spring enrollment	(begins August) (begins January)
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Part I - Students must submit the documents listed below to AACC in order to obtain the I-20 form:

- Anne Arundel Community College **F-1 International Student Application**. **There is NO application fee.**
- Original official transcripts** from secondary and post secondary schools attended, which must be translated by a certified translator. The college transcripts must be evaluated by one of the following translating services: World Education Services, Educational Credentials Evaluators or American Association of Collegiate Registrars. Transcripts evaluated by any other organizations will not be accepted.
- Test of English proficiency (TOEFL) scores** (www.toefl.org) or the AACC English placement test. An exemption from the English test may be given, if you have successfully completed an English course at an accredited US college or university or can show proof of completion from an accredited US agency. The AACC Math Placement test is required for Associates of Arts or Associates of Science degree program applicants.
- Documentation of financial support** for one academic year's tuition and living expenses. Submit a completed AACC Statement of Financial Resources form, and additional supporting documentation, including official bank statements or bank letters in English, not more than 3 months old, indicating that you are in possession of a minimum of \$19,600.00 in United States currency. Include an additional \$4000 per dependent. If a sponsor supports you, submit their bank statement or an official letter from the bank demonstrating the possession of funds to serve as your financial support for up to one year of study. Please include a Notarized Affidavit of Support (form I-134) if the sponsor is residing in the US. Go to www.uscis.gov to download and print the form I-134.
- Photocopies of passport page** with I-194 (front and back), visa page and DS 2019, if currently holding a J-1 visa. Two days after receiving an I-20 from AACC, pay SEVIS fee of **\$200** (www.fmjfee.com) and **print** the receipt.

- Completed Form I-539** (Application to Extend/Change Non-immigrant Status). The form can be downloaded at <http://uscis.gov>.
- Check or Money Order for \$300** US dollars payable to USCIS or U.S. Department of Homeland Security.
- Documentation of Financial Support**
- Photocopies of passport page**, I-94 (front and back), visa page and DS 2019 (Certificate of Eligibility for Exchange Visitor-J-1) if currently holding a J-1 visa.
- Original and current I-20** signed by student and DSO.
- Payment receipt of the \$200 SEVIS fee**
- Personal letter requesting change of status.** (See the example of a personal Change of Status letter.)
 - a. Explain the intent of your original entry
 - b. Explain how and when you decided to go to school and apply for a change of status
 - c. Explain your academic and professional plans, including the highest degree you plan to earn, field of study, establish your intent to return to your home country and why it is better to study in the US rather than in your home country.

Change of Status Request Statement

Applicants, please read the statement and sign below:

With specific exceptions, an alien already in the United States in non-immigrant status may apply for a change of status to F-1 status. The USCIS determines eligibility for a change of status in general. The college merely admits the student to an appropriate program based on academic eligibility and guaranteed financial ability to pursue the intended course of study.

Generally, non-immigrants who have filed a timely application for a change of status to a different non-immigrant status or have filed an application for extension of stay can remain in the United States while their application is pending. This assumes that the applicant was in valid non-immigrant status when he/she filed the application, and that the current non-immigrant status of the application will continue to be valid up to the date that the new status is requested to begin.

Please be aware that there is no guarantee that USCIS will agree to change your status. If the USCIS should deny your request to change status, you will be required to return to your country right away if your current visa status has expired.

Once the change of status request has been filed, you MUST NOT leave the country. If you leave the country before the request is decided by USCIS, you will forfeit the application for change of visa status. If the request for a change of status is approved, you may stay in the USA for as long as you are maintaining the guidelines of your status. However, if you leave the USA at any time, *even after the USCIS approves your change to F-1 status*, you will have to visit a U.S. Embassy or Consulate's Office in or near your home country to re-enter the USA with an F-1 visa. Submitting a Change of Status Request in the U.S. does not mean you have an F-1 visa! Submitting a Change of Status Request in the U.S. does not guarantee that you will be given an F-1 visa at the Embassy to re-enter the USA!

Individuals who entered the United States on a B1/B2 visa are not allowed to begin studies until they have received an approval of a Request To Change Status to F-1. J1 or H visa holders however, may enroll for a full course of study while approval is pending. The application process could possibly take several months.

I have read this page and understand the requirements and procedures for a Change of Status Request. I also understand that it is my responsibility to be fully aware of the legal obligations of my current nonimmigrant status and to fully comply with all related federal and state laws governing my status.
