



Transfer Student Procedures

Please follow the transfer request procedures if you are a student currently enrolled in another college or university with a valid I-20, have maintained F-1 student status and would like to transfer to Anne Arundel Community College. A student seeking to transfer cannot travel outside of the United States before beginning a program of study at AACC.

You must submit the following documentations at least 30 days before the start date of the requested term:

- Transfer Eligibility form:** It must be signed by your current Designated School Official (DSO), indicating that you are in good standing and “in status” as an international student. This sheet will also include your release date from SEVIS. After your SEVIS I-20, is released by your current school, AACC will print a new I-20 form. Your release date is usually the last day of classes or the end date of your I-20. You must submit an AACC Application for Admission, receive an acceptance letter to AACC, and the required documents prior to your release date. Once your previous college has released your record, you CANNOT change your mind and transfer to another school.
- Photocopy of passport, visa and I-94 form**
- Photocopy of current I-20 and all previous I-20 issued.**
- Complete Anne Arundel Community College **F-1 International Student Admission Application**
- Original official transcripts** from secondary and post secondary schools attended, which must be translated by a certified translator. The transcripts must be evaluated by one of the following translating services: World Education Services, Educational Credentials Evaluators or American Association of Collegiate Registrars. Transcripts evaluated by any other organizations will not be accepted. Official transcripts from previous U.S. schools attended must also be submitted.
- Test of English proficiency by submitting Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)** (www.toefl.org) or the AACC English placement test scores. An exemption from the English test may be given, if you have successfully completed an English course at an accredited US college or university or can show proof of completion from an accredited US agency. The AACC math placement test is required for Associates of Arts or Associates of Science degree applicants.
- Documentation of financial support** for one academic year’s tuition and living expenses. Submit a completed AACC Statement of Financial Resources form, and additional supporting documentation, including official bank statements or bank letters in English, not more than 3 months old, indicating that you are in possession of a minimum of \$19,600.00 in United States currency. Include an additional \$4000 per dependent. If a sponsor supports you, submit their bank statement or an official letter from the bank demonstrating the possession of funds to serve as your financial support for up to one year of study. Please include a notarized Affidavit of Support (Form I-134) if the sponsor is residing in the US. Go to the website, www.uscis.gov to download and print the form I-134.

Applicants must submit all of the above documentation to the Admission Office before a new I-20 form can be issued. A new I-20 will be printed for you after you have registered for a course load of 12 or more credit hours at AACC. Please call the Admission Office to pick up your new I-20. The entire transfer **process must be completed within 15 days before the start date of the program of study requested.**

To maintain F- I status, students must:

Maintain a valid passport. Your passport must be valid for at least 6 months after the time of submission of the Maintenance of Student F-1 Status Agreement Form.

1. Attend AACC, the school you are authorized to attend. You must attend the school that the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) last authorized for attendance. To determine this, look at the DHS stamp in the **upper right corner** of the I-20ID.
2. Apply for an extension of program **before** the expiration date on the I-20. Students must apply 30 days before the program's end date on the I-20 form.
3. Follow the USCIS procedures for changing from one program or educational level to another, for example, a change from the English as a Second Language program to an associate's or bachelor's degree.
4. Follow the USCIS procedures for transferring from one school to another.
5. Limit on-campus employment to 20 hours a week while school is in session. Full-time on-campus employment is permitted during vacation periods such as summer, as long as the student was enrolled full-time during preceding terms and intends to be enrolled full-time the following term.
6. Refrain from off-campus employment without authorization. Limit off-campus employment to 20 hours per week while school is in session. The student must obtain authorization for off-campus employment which is approved based on hardship or for part-time practical training.
7. Enroll in no more than one online course per semester.
8. Report a change of address to USCIS and DSO within 10 days of the change.
9. Pursue a full-time course of study and make normal progress towards the completion of the course of study: *Full-course of study and full-time study* are defined in the regulations as follows:
 - Undergraduate students: at least 12 credit hours per term, or the equivalent (as determined by district director in the school approval process).
 - Students enrolled in postsecondary language, liberal arts, fine arts, or other nonvocational program which confers associate or other degrees: at least 12 clock hours of instruction a week or its equivalent (as determined by the district director in the school approval process).

I have reviewed the regulations governing maintenance of visa status and have read page two of my I-20 form. I accept and will abide by the USCIS regulations and all of Anne Arundel Community College policies concerning federal and state F-1 student compliance guidelines.

I also certify that I know and understand the information on the Maintenance of Status Form and that I understand that it is my responsibility to notify not only the Records and Registration Office but also the Admission Office of any change in the information contained in my initial application and current records. I also understand that the information given to the Admission Office is both accurate and complete and that I am aware of the imposed USCIS sanctions for not being in compliance with my F-1 status.
