

Transportation, Logistics and Cargo Security Program

Anne Arundel Community College (AACC) has been awarded a \$2 million dollar Community-Based Job Training Grant from the U.S. Department of Labor. AACC will partner with local workforce investment boards, local and national cargo handling employers, local Job Corps centers, trade associations, state and local school systems, the Baltimore-Washington International Thurgood Marshall International Airport (BWI) and the Port of Baltimore in a unique program designed to:

- Develop a credit certificate program to create a pipeline of trained workers for the transportation, logistics, and cargo industry. Core courses include:
 - Introduction to Transportation and Logistics
 - Introduction to Airport and Seaport Operations
 - Transportation and Border Security
 - Domestic and International Freight Operations
 - Supply Chain Management
 - Cargo/Transportation Internship
- Upgrade the knowledge and skills of the incumbent workforce with a series of both online and face-to-face non-credit courses focused on specialized areas of training including:
 - Principles of Supervision
 - Imports/Exports
 - Customer Service
 - Homeland Security Issues in the Air Freight/Cargo Industry
 - Cargo/Warehouse Workplace Safety
- Reach out to targeted populations and develop a pipeline of new employees. Targeted groups will include: high school students, out-of-school youth, Job Corps participants, unemployed individuals, and displaced workers.
- Build the capacity of America's community colleges by making all curricula accessible through national associations such as the *League for Innovation in the Community College* and the *National Council for Continuing Education and Training*. As part of the scheduled grant activities, AACC will provide presentations at national conferences, as well as training and technical assistance to strategically targeted community colleges to ensure program integrity and compliance.
