The CAPM is designed for project team members and entry-level project managers, as well as qualified undergraduate and graduate students who want a credential to recognize their value to project team performance. A CAPM credential can benefit professionals from all disciplines. Professionals with project management skills are increasingly seen on the leadership track, and earning the CAPM from PMI is one of the best avenues toward career enhancement. CAPM candidates must first meet specific educational and project management-related experience requirements and then pass a comprehensive 150 question computer-based examination.

Eligibility Criteria

Educational Background:

High school diploma, associate's degree or global equivalent

Project Management Experience:

1,500 hours of professional experience on a project management team or;

Project Management Education:

23 contact hours of formal education

Project Management Professional (PMP®)

The PMP is the profession's most globally recognized and respected credential. The PMP designation demonstrates a solid foundation of knowledge from which you can competently practice project management. PMP candidates must first meet specific educational and project management experience requirements and agree to adhere to a code of professional conduct. The final step to becoming a PMP is passing a rigorous multiple-choice examination designed to objectively assess and measure the application of project management knowledge in the following six domains: initiating the project, planning the project, executing the project, monitoring and controlling the project, closing the project, and professional and social responsibility. This computer-based examination is administered globally with translation aids in 10 languages.

Eligibility Criteria

Educational Background:

High school diploma, associate's degree or global equivalent

Project Management Experience:

Minimum five years/60 months unique nonoverlapping professional project management experience during which at least 7,500 hours were spent leading and directing project tasks

Project Management Education:

35 contact hours of formal education

Or

Educational Background:

Bachelor's degree or global equivalent

Project Management Experience:

Minimum three years/36 months unique non-overlapping professional project management experience during which at least 4,500 hours were spent leading and directing project tasks

Project Management Education:

35 contact hours of formal education
