# MEET OUR FACULTY

**CHRISTINE ALEXANDER, Ed.S.**, is project manager at the Johns Hopkins Center for Technology in Education. She is an educational specialist who has worked with children with language-based learning difficulties. Her professional experience includes instructional and diagnostic work with students from kindergarten through college.

**AMY ALLEN-CHABOT, Ph.D.**, is a registered dietitian and associate professor of nutrition. She has worked with children and adults as a clinical practitioner and has considerable experience in weight management and disordered eating. One of her areas of expertise is translating nutrition knowledge into appropriate food choices for optimal health.

**RANDI ALTSCHULER, L.G.S.W.-C.**, is a child therapist who has worked with dying patients and their families, including specific group work with children ages 5-15 who experienced the death of a loved one. She has been a clinical intern at College Park Youth and Family Services and Calvert Hospice in Prince Frederick, Maryland.

**ANGIE ANTONIAK, L.C.W.S.-C.** is a licensed clinical social worker with more than 10 years experience working with children, adolescents and their parents. She currently has a small private practice. She's worked in elementary and middle school, as well as an alternative high school.

**LOU AYMARD, Ph.D.** is the founding director of The Parenting Center at Anne Arundel Community College. He is a child psychologist with 35 years of teaching and clinical experience working with children and families. He is the author of "Reflections on the Language and Culture of Deaf Americans" and has contributed chapters to child therapy texts about using electronic toys for counseling children. His many professional awards include the NISOD teaching excellence award, AACC Student Association's teaching excellence award, Humanitarian of the Year from the Warner Foundation of Baltimore and an award from the International Society for Child and Play Therapy for outstanding career contributions. Dr. Aymard currently teaches psychology at AACC and continues to serve as a key adviser to The Parenting Center.

**JENNIFER BLANCHARD, L.C.S.W.-C.**, is a psychotherapist in the Annapolis area specializing in play therapy with children and adolescents. She is also a school counselor who works with children, their families and faculty to promote resiliency as well as social and emotional wellness.

**DOREEN CAMPBELL, M.S. Ed.**, is an early childhood specialist with the Behavioral Emotional Support and Training (BEST) program of the TEACH Institute at AACC. She has received extensive training in play therapy and has both clinical and teaching experience with parents of preschool children.

**MARY CISSELL, M.S.**, teaches credit health and wellness courses at the college. She has been a certified CPR and first aid instructor with the Red Cross, the American Heart Association and the National Safety Council for more than 10 years. She is also a certified safety seat technician for the State of Maryland.

**CLAIRE COLE, M.A.**, is a registered nurse certified in gerontology. As an adjunct professor of psychology at AACC, she has taught courses in childhood, parenting and aging.

**JACLYN FINKLE, Ph.D.**, is an assistant professor with AACC's TEACH Institute. She has a master's degree in elementary education and history education from West Chester University and a doctoral degree in education from Capella University.

**LAURIE FRIEDMAN DONZE, Ph.D.**, is a clinical psychologist in private practice in Annapolis. She has researched eating behavior and obesity treatment for more than 20 years. From 1997 to 2003 she worked as the deputy director and supervising psychologist of the Johns Hopkins Weight Management Center in Baltimore where she evaluated and treated hundreds of obese and overweight children.

**MARCIE GIBBONS, L.C.S.W.-C.** is a clinical social worker specializing in grief and loss issues. She earned a master's degree in social work from Catholic University, is a counselor at Archbishop Spalding High School and has a private practice.

**CORDELIA HOLBERT, Ph.D.**, earned a doctorate of philosophy from De Paul University. She is a licensed clinical social worker in private practice and an assistant professor of psychology at Anne Arundel Community College. Her specialty is youth and adolescence.

**KATHLEEN B. JOHNSON, M.Ed.**, is a retired elementary school teacher with more than 30 years of experience working with children and their families. She also teaches child care and teacher education at AACC.

**ANN B. JUDGE, Ph.D.** is a licensed psychologist in Washington, D.C., a co-founder of Insight Psychological Consulting, LLC and an adjunct supervisor for the counseling psychology doctorate program at the University of Maryland.
