Q How do I access a non-credit online class?

A Depending on the vender/partner that is used you would follow the instructions that is linked to the course.

Q What is Distance Education?

A Distance education provides a convenient, standardized, and economical approach for our students to learn. Students attend class from anywhere - in the office, at home, at school, or on the road, and study at a pace that's right for them. With courses that are either instructor-led or self-paced, with or without a live chat or web conferencing component, AACC, can assist you with your educational needs.

Q What do I do after I register?

A You should receive a written confirmation in the mail that will let you know what vender you are taking the class with. Then you would follow the instructions for that online partner/vender.

Q What if I do not get a confirmation?

A Please call the Instructional Support Center Office 410-777-2325. They can mail a confirmation, or let students know who the vender is.

Q What is an online partner/vender?

A Anne Arundel Community College offers a wide range of noncredit online courses to meet your educational needs. Anne Arundel Community College offers courses developed at AACC and collaborates with a number of partners to make certain we offer a large variety of online courses to our students.

Q What is the payment/refund policy?

Q What is a Hybrid Course?

A. Hybrid is commonly used to describe courses that combine face-to-face classroom instruction with computer-based learning. A hybrid course essentially splits the required classroom time between campus rooms and the Internet, resulting in a reduction of the amount of time spent on campus.

If you have registered for a hybrid course, you must attend scheduled meetings on campus, as printed in the AACC Schedule of Credit Classes.

Q Is Distance Education For Me?

A. Online courses at Anne Arundel Community College offer students an opportunity to take classes that fit their schedule and learning style. Distance learning students work more independently than is typical for regular in-class courses. This means that online students are responsible for their own success by structuring their time, meeting deadlines, and completing assignments.
